The purpose of this Service Announcement is to remind customers of the changes that will be introduced in London Stock Exchange next functional release 1.25.3. As per our communication in [001/08102025](#), the production go-live date for this release is scheduled for **Monday 8 December 2025**.

The Next Functional Release 1.25.3 includes the following changes:

- Enabling Iceberg and Hidden orders during the Closing Price Crossing (CPX) session
- Introduction of a new matching engine partition

Please note that London Stock Exchange will cancel all GTD orders in the Production environment for the 17 segments listed in the attached [appendix](#) of previous communication, 001/08102025. The deletions will be carried out on Friday 5 December 2025 prior to the invocation of the post close session.
